THE PURPOSE OF THE SUBJECT, LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Focusing on the traditional analog printing techniques, the students explore the new possibilities of graphic-, printmaking-, and illustration design mixing analog and digital technologies. They develop their manual and digital skills and creativity.

SUMMARY OF THE CONTENT OF THE SUBJECT

Focusing on the traditional analog printing techniques, we also explore the new possibilities of graphic and printmaking and illustration design mixing the analog and digital technologies.

The main topic of the course: the development of printmaking skills: relief processes (lino cut,

woodcut, letterpress printing), intaglio processes (engraving, drypoint, etching, aquatint, mezzotint), and planography printing techniques (lithography, serigraphy, monotype).

Experimental techniques: frottage, rust print, collagraph, etc.)

Papers, inks, colors, tools, printing machines, technologies.

STUDENT'S TASKS AND PLANNED LEARNING ACTIVITIES:

1. Illustration series for a novel. min. 5 illustration by one of the printmaking techniques. Designing the book cover, and the whole book with text and illustration. The series will be made by the preferred technics, which fit the original sketches.

2. Jar Label Design with a graphic element made by printmaking technique

3. Everyday Horror task for Risography pr digital print in A3 form

4. Etching task - machinery or structure

5. optional task: Litography

EVALUATION OF THE SUBJECT:

- Conditions for completing the course, assessment criteria:
Regular attendance in class and the completion of extra-curricular activities are a prerequisite for receiving a grade. A presentation of the semester portfolio is required for grading.

- Criteria for grading:
